OUTLINE

Enclosed in this Student Voting Plan are the voter empowerment activities of Montgomery College in compliance with the HB156 Student and Military Voter Empowerment Act (Chapter 656/SB 283 (Chapter 657) for public higher education institutions. DESIGNATION OF STUDENT VOTING COORDINATOR

Montgomery College designated the Office of Community Engagement as the convener of the MC Votes committee and Gloria Bonilla, Community Engagement Associate Director, as the Student Voting Coordinator. Ms. Bonilla has over 15 years of experience working at Montgomery College in various departments.

STUDENT VOTER ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES FOR 2021

Montgomery College continued to promote several voter empowerment efforts over the 2021 calendar year. On March 13, 2020, Montgomery College pivoted to remote operations for employees and students, and began the return to campus transition over the summer of 2021, with some in-person classes and services returning in the fall of 2021. Despite a lack of in-person outreach, Montgomery College continued to host effective voter engagement programming. A description of key College efforts is provided below, followed by a list of specific outreach efforts hosted by different departments.

The Office of Community Engagement convened three meetings of the MC Votes committee, which is led by a representative from Student Affairs (Lisa Hackley), Academic Affairs (Professor Joe Stumpf), and the Office of Community Engagement (Karla Silvestre). Our Voting Coordinator is Gloria Bonilla. The meetings were used to learn about different departments' efforts in voter engagement and to plan for the upcoming year's mid-term elections. The former MC Votes convener, Nik Sushka, presented data from the National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement at these meetings. From this presentation, we learned about Montgomery College students' voter registration and voting rates, which helped us to create our voter empowerment plan for the upcoming year.

Some faculty at Montgomery College incorporated voter empowerment lessons into their classes this fall that were developed for the general election in 2020. Other faculty invited local elected officials to their virtual classes to discuss a number of topics of importance to students, such as civic education, elections, and current events. The faculty representative of our MC Votes committee presented to all faculty chairs on the resources available to them on voting so they can begin to plan to integrate lessons into the courses for the spring and fall semesters of 2022.

The Office of Student Life held numerous events throughout the year to engage students in voting and civic education. On Student Advocacy Day, for example, students learned about the importance of voting and advocacy, and they discussed issues of importance to them with elected officials. Students from all 16 Maryland community colleges were present. On National Voter Registration Day, Student Life hosted the League of Women Voters to conduct in-person outreach on each of our campuses and on multiple days. In collaboration with the Political Science Department, Student Life hosted a Kahoot trivia event to assess students' knowledge of local and national voting. Another event in collaboration with the Political Science department was the "What is Gerrymandering?" event where students used manipulatives to explore how gerrymandering works and how political parties can legally take away voting rights.

The Office of Compliance, Risk, and Ethics sent out a reminder to all students on how they can register to vote. The communication contained both College, county, and state resources.

VOTER REGISTRAION PLAN FOR 2022

Goal: MC students register to vote, become informed about key races, and vote in all elections using early voting, mail-in ballots, absentee ballots, and on Election Day

- 1. Strategies to promote student voter registration:
 - a. Develop a communications plan to promote voter registration (short videos by students, social media, posters, TV monitors, etc.)
 - i. Who is responsible: Office of Community Engagement and Montgomery College Television (MCTV)
 - ii. By when: First video produced by Feb. 1, 2022, and five additional videos by. June 1 2022.
 - b. Hire four student ambassadors to do peer-to-peer voter promotion activities for the spring, summer, and fall semesters
 - i. Responsible: Office of Community Engagement
 - ii. By When: January 15, 2022
 - c. Tabling events at key in-person days on each campus such as the start of spring, summer, and fall semesters
 - i. Responsible: Office of Student Life
 - ii. By When: monthly in the spring semester
 - d. Conduct a training for faculty, staff, and ambassadors on how to complete a voter registration form
 - i. Responsible: MC Votes committee
 - ii. By When: May 1, 2022
- 2. Strategies to Inform Students on key races:
 - a. Promotion (electronic and hard copy) of Voter Guides
 - i. Responsible: Office Community Engagement and MC Votes committee
 - ii. By When: a month before the primary and general election
 - b. Events on campus and virtual by Student Life and Faculty
 - i. Responsible: Office of Student Life and individual faculty members
 - ii. By When: monthly
 - c. Host a candidate event
 - i. Responsible: in partnership with Leadership Montgomery and the College's Office of Government Relations
 - ii. By When: March 2, 2022
- 3. Strategies to help students vote on election days:
 - a. Buses to the polls (Party to the Polls)
 - i. Responsible: Office of Student Life, Office of Community Engagement, and MC Votes committee
 - ii. By When: Reserve buses by March 1, 2021


